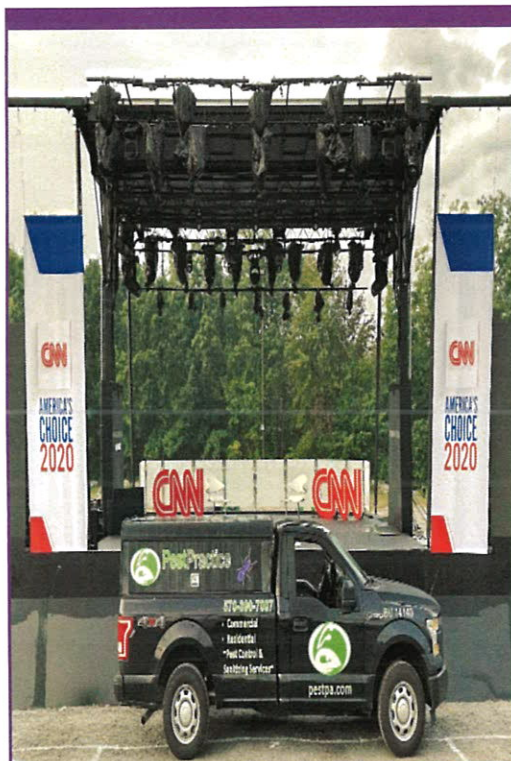

Section Two: Environmental, Health & Safety Clauses

- a. The Contractor shall undertake to minimize the negative impact of the pest control services on the environment.
- b. The Contractor shall make every endeavour to safeguard health and safety of people and animals in the Property against any perils of using pesticides.
- c. The Contractor shall make every endeavour to minimize using pesticides when carrying out pest control services under this Contract.
- d. The Contractor shall provide the Customer with a list of pesticides which will be used in the course of carrying out the pest control services. The list must clearly specify all pesticide data which shall include "trade name", "supplier (permit no. / licence no.)", "percentage of all the active ingredients", "registration number", "type of treatment", "area to use" & "application method".



- e. The Contractor shall provide the customer with "material safety data sheets" upon request of the customer.
- f. All pesticides that will be used by the Contractor must have been registered in accordance with Pesticides Ordinance (Chapter 133).
- g. All pesticides that will be used by the Contractor in the Property must be stored in a container(s) that is impervious to that pesticide and sufficiently strong to prevent leakage arising from the ordinary risks of handling and transport. There must be a label on the container(s) setting forth, clearly and distinctly the following particulars both in English and Chinese:
 - (i) the word "Poison",
 - (ii) the expression "Keep out of reach of children" and
 - (iii) the registration number of the pesticide.
- h. The Contractor shall ensure that its agents, workers or employees, who apply pesticides in the Property, must be sufficiently trained to carry out the pest control services correctly and safely.

Section Three: Other Terms

- a. The Contractor shall provide all necessary tools, applicators, device, equipment and supplies for the performance of its services under this Contract. Such tools, applicators, device, equipment and supplies must be at all times kept in good working order.
- b. All services performed under this Contract will be subject, before payment, to inspection by the Customer who may withhold payment when in his opinion the Contractor's services have not been performed in accordance with the requirements of this Contract.
- c. Subject to Section One (b) of this Contract, the Contractor shall provide the customer with a work schedule which shall clearly specify the frequency of the treatments to be carried out by the Contractor under this Contract. The Customer shall have power as he thinks fit to vary the frequency specified in the work schedule and no variation shall vitiate this Contract. Should the Customer require more or less work to be carried out, the value of such work shall be added or deducted from the contract sum at rates as mutually agreed by the Customer and the Contractor.
- d. The Contractor shall be solely liable for and shall indemnify the Customer against any loss, claim or proceeding whatsoever, arising out of any statutory regulations, legislation or at common law in respect of injury to or death of any person or animal resulting from application of pesticides by the Contractor, its agents, employees, servants or workers whether or not due to negligence.

NOTICE OF PROPOSED ELECTRIC RATE CHANGES

October 29, 2020

Re: 560 ROUTE 6 & 209

To Our Electric Customers:

This letter replaces our letter to you of October 21, 2020, notifying you of our filing of a request for a utility rate increase. We are sending you this revised letter to notify you of the docket number that was assigned to this case after the date when the company drafted the letter, and to correct typographical errors in the initial letter. The docket number for this case is **R-2020-3022135**.

Pike County Light and Power Company, Inc. is filing a request with the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission (PUC) to increase your electric rates beginning on December 28, 2020. This notice describes the company's rate request, the PUC's role, and what actions you can take.

Pike County Light and Power Company, Inc. has requested an overall rate increase of \$1,933,600 per year. If the company's entire request is approved, customer bills would increase as follows:

- Residential customers using 674 kWh per month would increase from \$103.90 to \$121.90 per month, or by 17.3%, including estimated energy charges.
- SC2 primary commercial customers using 105,514 kWh per month would increase from \$9,958.27 to \$11,225.55 per month, or by 12.7%, including estimated energy charges and sales tax.
- SC2 secondary demand commercial customers using 3,308 kWh per month would increase from \$450.61 per month to \$552.89 per month, or by 22.7%, including estimated energy charges and sales tax.
- SC2 secondary non-demand commercial customers using 532 kWh per month would increase from \$70.46 per month to \$87.59 per month, or by 24.3%, including estimated energy charges and sales tax.
- Municipal street lighting customer bills would increase on average from \$933.15 per month to \$1,250.09 per month, or by 34.0%, including estimated energy charges.
- Private lighting customer bills would increase on average from \$39.29 to \$51.35 per month, or by 30.7%, including estimated energy charges and sales tax.

To determine your customer class or how the requested increase may affect your electric bill, contact Pike County Light & Power Company at (855) 855-2050 or (570) 832-2988. The rates requested by the company may be found in TARIFF SUPPLEMENT NO. 82 TO TARIFF-ELECTRIC PA PUC NO. 8. You may examine the material filed with the PUC which explains the requested increase and the reasons for it. A copy of this material is kept at Pike County Light & Power's office. The

state agency that approves rates for public utilities is the PUC. The PUC will examine the requested rate increase and can prevent existing rates from changing until it investigates and/or holds hearings on the request. The company must prove that the requested rates are reasonable.

After examining the evidence, the PUC may grant all, some, or none of the request or may reduce existing rates. The PUC may change the amount of the rate increase (or decrease) requested by the utility for each customer class. As a result, the rate charged to you may be different than the rate requested by the company and shown on the previous page.

There are three ways to challenge a company's request to change its rates:

1. *You can file a formal complaint.*

If you want a hearing before a PUC judge, you must file a formal complaint. By filing a formal complaint, you assure yourself the opportunity to take part in hearings about the rate increase request. All complaints should be filed with the PUC before December 1, 2020. Your complaint should contain the docket number identified at the beginning of this letter. If no formal complaints are filed, the Commission may grant all, some, or none of the request without holding a hearing before a PUC judge.

2. *You can send the PUC a letter stating why you object to the requested rate increase.*

Correspondence with the PUC can inform the Commission about problems with the company's service or management. This information can be helpful when the PUC investigates the rate request. Send your letter to the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission, Post Office Box 3265, Harrisburg, PA 17105-3265.

3. *You can be a witness at a public input hearing.*

Public input hearings are held if the PUC opens an investigation of the company's rate request. At these hearings, you have the opportunity to present your views in person to the presiding PUC judge. All testimony is given under oath and becomes part of the official rate case record. These hearings are held at a location in the company's service territory. For more information, call the PUC's Bureau of Consumer Services at 1-800-692-7380. You may leave your name and address so you can be notified of any public input hearings that may be scheduled in this case.

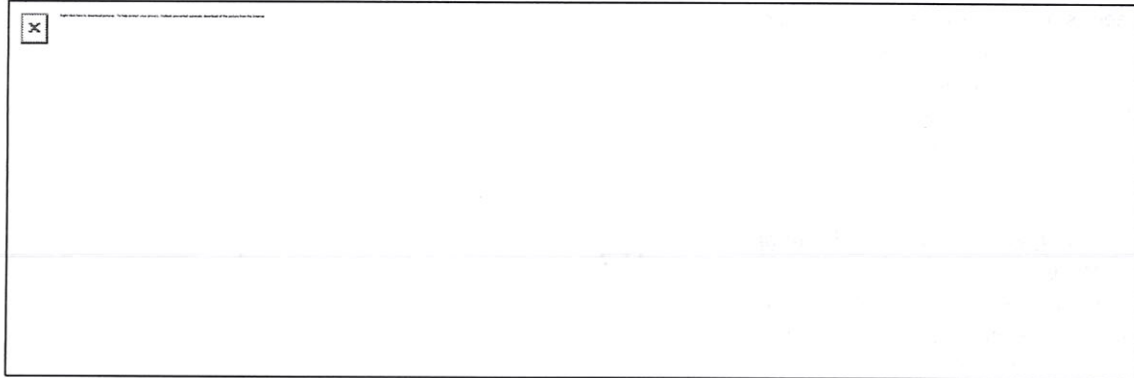

Attached please find a draft "sign-on" letter alerting Pike County residents and visitors to the importance of adhering to measures to reduce Covid transmission.

Several members of the Milford Borough Council's Public Safety Committee and all three Pike County Commissioners have already signed the letter. Before releasing the sign-on letter to the media on Monday, we would like to have as many elected officials and first responders, as well as community, business, faith and non-profit leaders to join us in endorsing this important message.

As of this past Friday, November 6, our 14-day trailing new cases per 100,000 population metric was 88.3; prospectively, it is projected at 108.1. Our one day test positivity rate was 18.4% (on 49 tests). These are not good numbers and if we want our businesses and schools to stay open, it is imperative that we act quickly to encourage the community to redouble our efforts.

You may recall a few weeks ago when the rates went up and with a concerted effort, they were brought back down again. This rise is more serious, so it is even more important that we take action.

If we can add your name to the letter before releasing it to the media at noon on Monday, please respond to this email or to protectpike@gmail.com with your permission and how you would like your name listed (note title if appropriate). We also, if funds become available, may run this letter and the signers as an ad in local papers to underscore its importance.

Open Letter to our Pike County Neighbors

Pike County has much to be proud of concerning our response to the Covid pandemic. We have, as a community, worked together to raise awareness, reduce transmission and provide care for those affected by the virus itself as well as by the economic consequences of the shutdown.

Our effective response—which has included cooperative efforts between governmental, public health, business and community leadership—has enabled us to safely open our schools and businesses. We are fortunate that Pike County's Covid transmission rate has at times been one of the lowest of any county in Pennsylvania.

However, we also are conscious that Covid transmission rates are rising across the country; Pennsylvania has recently recorded more new cases than at any time since the beginning of the pandemic. Cases in Pike County have risen substantially in recent days.
