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MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING MILFORD AMBULANCE TAX AND PAID EMS PERSONNEL - 2021

WHEREAS, Basic Life Support Ambulance Services are a crucial and necessary part of protecting the health, safety and welfare of the community; and

WHEREAS, the Pennsylvania law makes the provision of such emergency services the responsibility of each municipality; and

WHEREAS, the Milford Fire and Ambulance Company, hereinafter referred to as "the Ambulance Company" has a long and proud tradition of providing BLS Ambulance Services to Milford Township, Milford Borough and a certain section of Dingman Township, and which includes the Ambulance Company having the appropriate license(s), ambulance vehicle and location where said ambulance is maintained when not in use; and

WHEREAS, the Ambulance Company frequently serves outside of its primary service area when called upon for mutual aid, including to Shohola Township which does not have a primary service provider at this time; and

WHEREAS, the Ambulance Company has faced a significant decline in the number of volunteers available to provide this service, which decline was heightened and hastened by the COVID-19 pandemic but which is also commonly happening throughout rural Pennsylvania;

WHEREAS, the municipalities receiving service through the Ambulance Company have sought to provide the Ambulance Company with the funds necessary to allow the Ambulance Company to contract for paid personnel to augment the volunteer force through the provision of General Fund and Special Assessment EMS/Ambulance Property Taxes;

WHEREAS, the Ambulance Company has developed a relationship with a staffing entity, Delaware Valley EMS, hereinafter referred to as "DVEMS", to provide for the necessary personnel and handle the administrative and related tax and insurance requirements necessary for said paid personnel;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the parties agree to their respective roles in this collaborative relationship to provide EMS Services for 2021, being as follows:

Milford Township will provide the Ambulance Company with the newly designated ambulance tax revenue as per its 2021 Budget, some \$56,000;

Milford Borough will provide the Ambulance Company with the newly designated tax revenue as per its 2021 Budget, some \$40,000;

Dingman Township will provide the Ambulance Company with the newly designated tax revenue as per its 2021 Budget, some \$40,900;

Shohola Township will provide the Ambulance Company with the newly designated tax revenue as per its 2021 Budget;

The Ambulance Company will use these tax dollars to provide paid personnel, through its relationship with DVEMS or another staffing entity as may be required and prudent, on the

following schedule which is based on the most difficult time periods to obtain volunteers and the highest call volume periods based on historical data:

1/1-4/30/21, 5 days per week, Monday through Friday 7 am - 7 pm; 5/1-9/30/21, 7 days per week, 7 am - 7 pm; 10/1-12/31/21, 5 days per week, Monday through Friday 7 am - 7 pm;

The Ambulance Company will be provided the funds necessary in advance of the services being provided as the Ambulance Company does not have the desire nor capacity to manage such a cash flow outlay;

The Ambulance Company will be responsible for third party billing and collections efforts for the services provided and will use the funds generated in order to continue to provision for ambulance services including the supplies, gasoline, insurance, maintenance and housing of the ambulance;

The Ambulance Company will provide the municipalities with a written report on no less than a quarterly basis, no more than 30 days after the end of each calendar quarter, as to the number of calls responded to and how many of those resulted in transports and how many calls were located in each municipality, the funds expended for service, broken down into paid personnel costs and the various costs for provision of service as outlined above; and on a semi-annual basis the Ambulance Company will provide the municipalities with reports as to the break down of calls made by volunteers or paid personnel and the revenue collected from billing and collections;

The Ambulance Company will allow a municipal liaison to participate in its meetings regularly to increase communication and understanding between the municipalities and the volunteers of the Ambulance Company;

This MOU shall be revisited during the annual budget cycles of the municipalities.
