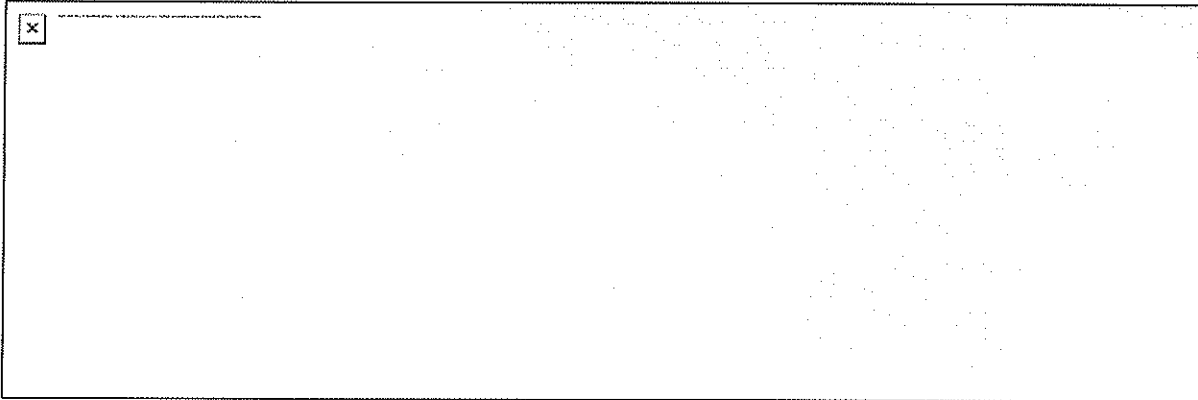

Make Sure Your Township Has the Earliest Access to Salary Survey Results!

Be sure your designated township staff (*PSATS Salary Survey Plus processor*) enters your township's wage and benefit data by **August 18** to ensure the earliest access to all PSATS Salary Survey Plus reports this year, including comparisons to 2018-2020 results, question by question comparisons, and reports by region, population, budget size, union status, benefits, and more!

Townships that participate in this secure survey enable their township supervisors, managers, secretaries, and other township-authorized employees to view the data entered and run real-time reports and comparisons with townships most like yours. To protect anonymity, results are only provided for questions that receive responses from at least five townships.

Turnpike Announces 2022 Toll Rate Increase

The Pennsylvania Turnpike Commission has announced a 5% toll increase for 2022 for both E-Z Pass and TOLL BY PLATE customers. The increase will take effect January 2, 2022. E-Z Pass drivers will continue to receive the lowest toll rates.

Tolls have increased significantly since 2009 due to required payments to fund

transit operations under Act 44 of 2009. The Turnpike's final \$450 million payment will be made later this month, and future payments will drop to \$50 million annually. However, the Turnpike has amassed significant debt in its efforts to meet its funding obligations for transit since 2009 and will be paying off this debt for decades. Federal Grants Available for Local Arts

The National Endowment for the Arts has released guidelines and applicant resources for funding opportunities through the American Rescue Plan for arts and culture organizations. Nonprofit arts organizations, local governments, and local arts agencies may apply for grants of \$50,000 to \$150,000. Applications are due **August 12**, and a webinar about the grant will be held tomorrow, **July 8**, at noon. Pennsylvania Remains at 13th for Vaccine Doses Administered Per Capita

According to the Centers for Disease Control, Pennsylvania remains at 13th for total COVID doses administered per capita. Nationally, more than 157 million people have been fully vaccinated, or 58.3% of the adult population. The CDC's data shows that 60.8% of Pennsylvanians age 18 and older are now fully vaccinated. Both Pennsylvania and the United States fell short of their 70% goals by Independence Day, but PA is above the national average.

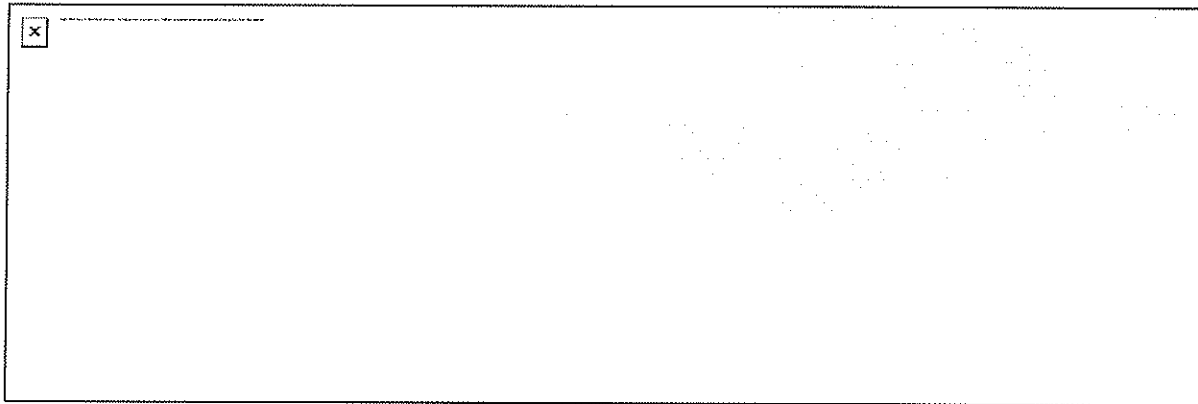

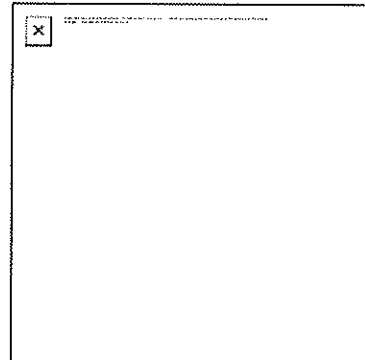

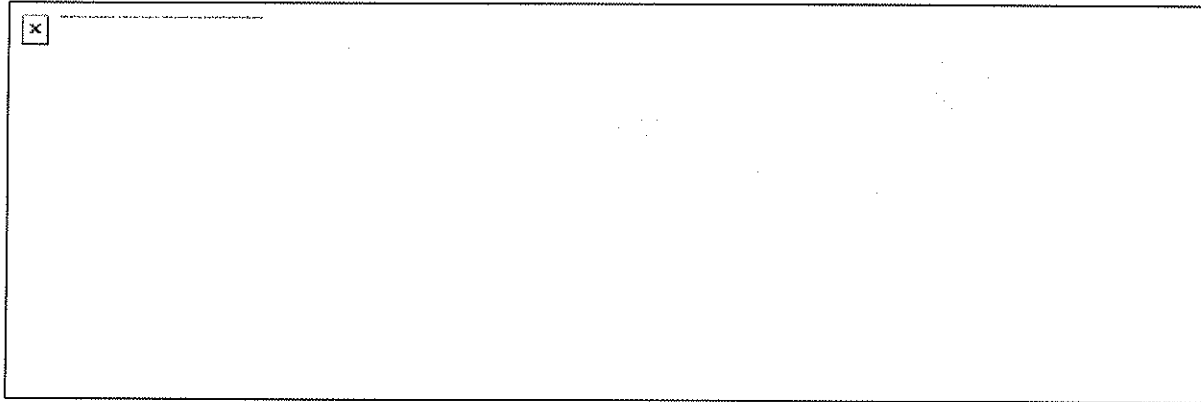

The Commonwealth Financing Authority (CFA) is accepting grant applications for its Multimodal Transportation Fund **until July 31**. Note that this is different than the Multimodal Transportation Fund through the state Department of Transportation.

The Multimodal Transportation Fund provides grants to encourage economic development and ensure that a safe and reliable system of transportation is available to the commonwealth's residents. Funds may be used for the development, rehabilitation, and enhancement of transportation assets to existing communities, including streetscapes, lighting, sidewalk enhancement, pedestrian safety, connectivity of transportation assets, and transit-oriented development. Pa. COVID-19 Cases, Hospitalizations, Deaths Drop

1,168 new cases of COVID-19 were reported last week, a 17.5% decrease over the prior week. The statewide COVID-19 total case count now stands at 1,214,187. There were only 12 states with rate increases with Missouri, Arkansas, and Florida making up the top three.

For the 12th week in a row, the [number of COVID-19 hospitalizations in Pennsylvania](#) has decreased from 293 to 267, down 9%. Fifty-eight of these patients are in an ICU, up from 53 the prior week. The number of COVID-19 patients on a ventilator statewide decreased from 44 to 39.

Deaths attributed to COVID-19 in Pennsylvania decreased for the seventh week in a row. Forty-two deaths were reported this week, 21% less than in the previous week. Total deaths in Pennsylvania have reached 27,749.

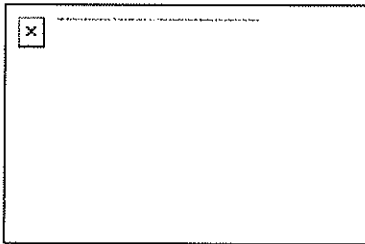
After decreasing for 11 straight weeks, Pennsylvania's statewide percent-positivity rate increased slightly from 1.1% to 1.2% this week and remains below 5% for the eighth week in a row. 65 counties now have rates less than 5%. The remaining two counties (Cameron and Potter) have rates of 5% to less than 10% (*up from one last week*). [Click here](#) for more county-specific information.

Final Budget Bill Takes Effect without Governor's Signature

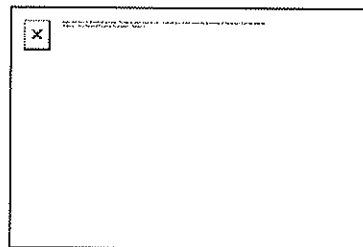
On July 9, the final piece of the budget package went into effect without the governor's signature. [Act 70 of 2021 \(formerly HB 336\)](#) amends the Administrative Code to move administration of the Floodplain Management Act from the state Department of Community and Economic Development to the Pennsylvania Emergency Management Agency, which will take effect September 6. In addition, it directs the Independent Fiscal Office, upon the request of a committee chair or legislative leadership, to prepare a revenue estimate for any bill or amendment that would have an estimated impact of \$50 million or more in any one year.

Reminder: Townships Need to Apply for American Rescue Plan Funds ASAP

Township officials are reminded that each township with a population of less than 50,000 must apply for its American Rescue Plan funds through the state

Department of Community and Economic Development's Single Application for Assistance as soon as possible but no later than July 29. **Failure to file by July 29 could result in forfeiture of your allocation.** Townships with populations of 50,000 or more must apply directly through the U.S. Treasury.

More than 1,300 townships have applied so far, and every township in the following counties have applied: Adams, Allegheny, Bucks, Cumberland, Delaware, Elk, Erie, Fayette, Forest, Fulton, Lancaster, Lebanon, Lehigh, Mifflin, Montgomery, Northampton, Pike, Venango, Westmoreland, and York. The Pennsylvania Department of Treasury has issued two rounds of payments to date.

Please note that ALL townships are now required to apply for a SAM.gov registration, and proof of application for a SAM.gov account is required for the DCED Single Application. **You do NOT need to wait for approval for SAM.gov before applying to DCED.**

This Day in History...

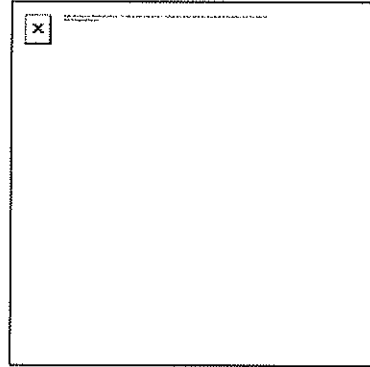
On July 13, 1960, In Los Angeles, California, Senator John F. Kennedy of Massachusetts is nominated for the presidency by the Democratic Party Convention, defeating Senator Lyndon B. Johnson of Texas. The next day, Johnson was named Kennedy's running mate by a unanimous vote of the convention. Four months later, on November 8, Kennedy won 49.7 percent of the popular vote in one of the closest presidential elections in U.S. history, surpassing by a fraction the 49.6 percent received by Vice President Richard M. Nixon, a Republican.

Township Warning on Unemployment Fraud

Rampant computer problems continue to plague the state Labor & Industry Unemployment Fund's new system, with fraud attempts running even higher than before. PSATS reminds all townships to closely monitor and respond quickly to potentially fraudulent claims that ultimately will be charged against the township and taxpayers. *(As an aside, there have been several fraudulent claims discovered that were filed on behalf of active, employed PSATS staffers.)*

Spotlight PA, a media watchdog group today reports the following additional issue with the Department of Labor & Industry:

"Democratic Gov. Tom Wolf's administration completed its internal investigation into a multimillion-dollar unemployment mistake in mid-2017, but failed to make the findings public until this week, according to newly released documents.

In response to questions by Spotlight PA, [the Office of Inspector General late Tuesday released a one-page summary of its inquiry into a state error](#) that resulted in thousands of unemployed Pennsylvanians being overcharged millions in interest payments over a decade."

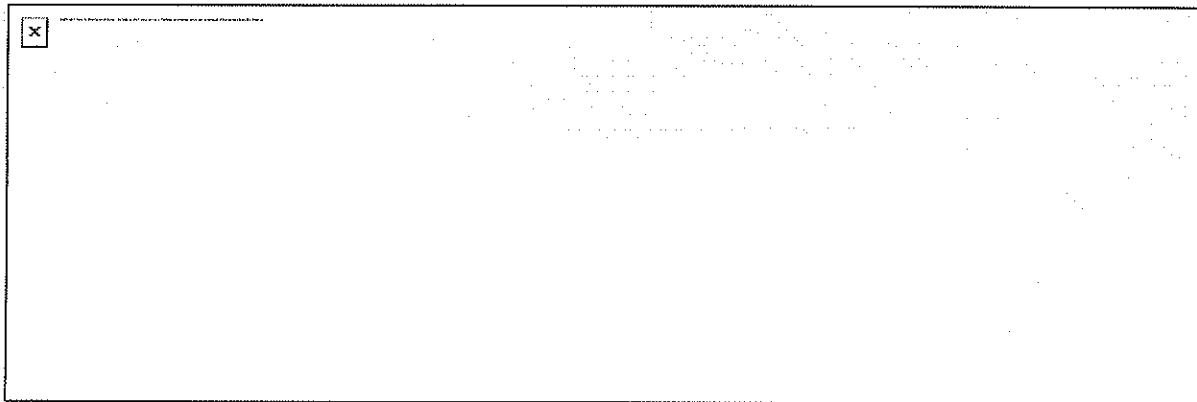

PA Treasury Processes ARP Distributions

Pennsylvania Treasurer Stacy Garrity announced that the third batch of payments under the American Rescue Plan has been sent to 619 municipalities that applied for the funding through the state Department of Community and Economic Development. To date payments have been made to 1,752 municipalities for \$421 million. [Click here](#) for more from Treasury.

As a reminder, DCED recommends using **352.53 or 352.530, Federal Entitlements to Governmental Units**, from the Chart of Accounts to record this new revenue source.

PUC Adopts Notice of Pipeline Rulemaking

The Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission unanimously adopted a [Notice of Proposed Rulemaking](#) regarding regulations for the pipeline transportation of petroleum products and hazardous liquids in intrastate commerce and is seeking public comment on the rulemaking. Comments will be accepted for 60 days from the date the notice is published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* through the commission's e-filing system referencing Docket No. L-2019-3010267.

The rulemaking is PUC's latest step in a [comprehensive process to explore and address pipeline safety regulations in Pennsylvania](#). The proposed rulemaking initiated today follows the PUC review and analysis of more than 90 comments from community advocates and citizens' organizations, local governments, industry affiliates, members of the Pennsylvania General Assembly, and concerned citizens.

PUC Seeking Comments on Proposed Pipeline Settlement

The Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission is accepting public comments on a proposed settlement for a pipeline failure and fire in Beaver County involving the

"Revolution Pipeline" operated by Energy Transfer Company. The failure occurred in September 2018 in Center Township and released more than three million cubic feet of natural gas and caused a fire that burned for several hours. 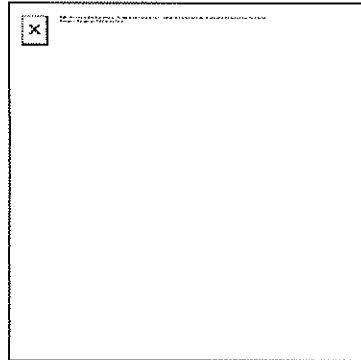
